### A New Way to Play

Most of us have fond childhood memories playing at recess with friends on our school playgrounds – daring each other to swing higher, jump farther, and spin faster. Indeed,



play is critical for physical, cognitive, emotional, and social development.

In Haiti, playgrounds are a luxury most communities cannot afford. So CCH is working with our partner schools and our volunteers to build simple playground equipment for students to use at recess. So far we have made colorful obstacle courses and balance beams using recycled tires and PVC pipes at two schools.

Our staff are planning to add toy motorcycles, see-saws, and maybe swings in the future. As you can see, the kids LOVE using their new play equipment at recess!

CCH's Leadership Development program continues to take shape. Key staff members and partners met most recently on June 2nd with professional facilitator Linc Cummings to refine our approach and explore next steps for the program.

#### Healing Touch

CCH's Physical Therapy Rehab Center is the only dedicated PT center in southeast Haiti. Free of charge to patients, it meets a vital need in the community. Patients work hard every day, often traveling far from home to access care.

This spring we had two teams of PT volunteers who taught hands-on techniques to our Haitian PT staff, performed scoliosis screenings at CCH partner schools, advised on how to improve clinic layout and patient flow, and conducted a series of in-service trainings on treatment strategies for stroke patients.

These scoliosis screenings are even more important in rural schools because children tend to carry heavy loads of water at young ages.

> Stroke is a major issue in Haiti and at our rehab center, 33% of the patients we see have suffered a stroke. CCH has been educating our PT staff as well as creating stroke awareness materials to display in our waiting room as

well as stroke prevention and detection lessons to share with the local population.
