Patient consultations at the CCH Primary Care and PT/OT Rehab Clinics **500**

Students received free wellness check ups from the CCH mobile clinic at their school **50**

Partner school students referred for follow-on care at CCH Clinics or specialty services 12

Clinic staff received professional development training in 6 patient care topics

CCH operates a Primary Care Clinic, a PT/OT Rehab Clinic, and a pharmacy. We provide school nurses 3 days a week at 3 rural schools, so that the nurses can treat sick children, teach health and hygiene lessons, and answer health-related questions from parents. We also send our mobile clinic out to partner schools to provide free wellness checks and medicine for students 1-3 times per year. All of our healthcare services are provided at low or no cost with sliding scale fees so that healthcare is accessible to ALL who walk through our doors.

In the first half of 2024, pharmaceutical costs have skyrocketed while their availability has decreased. We are struggling to keep our Clinics stocked with everything our patients need. We continue to seek out partnerships and shipping options to help alleviate this strain.

CCH has invested over a year in 4 of our principals becoming Instructional Coaches for their schools. In July, they were able to attend a week of on-site training with education experts from CCH partner organizations Model School Network, Summits Education, & Blue Butterfly.


Hours of gardening lessons teaching 450 elementary school kids how to grow food

CCH continues to partner with 8 different communities around Jacmel, Haiti, offering livestock programs like goats and beekeeping to help families earn a living. We work with leaders to assess their community's strengths and weaknesses, then we match up areas where they need assistance with available resources at CCH or from other providers. We also gather community leaders together for training seminars on farming best practices, how to develop a project and get funding for it, and how to communicate effectively to improve program success.
